

## Min's Dynasty Home Care Instructions Permanent Makeup & Microblading

**Failure to follow these instructions may result in pigment color loss and may require an entirely new procedure not at touch-up prices but at full price!**  
**All permanent make-up procedures are a two-step process.**

### Scheduling Touch Ups

Touch-up visits should be scheduled between 30-45 days post procedure. No touch up appointments will be made earlier than 30 days after the last procedure without exception. This is for the protection of the client. Skin must be given enough time to heal before it can again take ink during a touch up procedure. Working on skin that has not been given enough time to heal can also lead to scarring. All Permanent Make-up procedures are a two-step process. Results are not determined until touch-up application is completed.

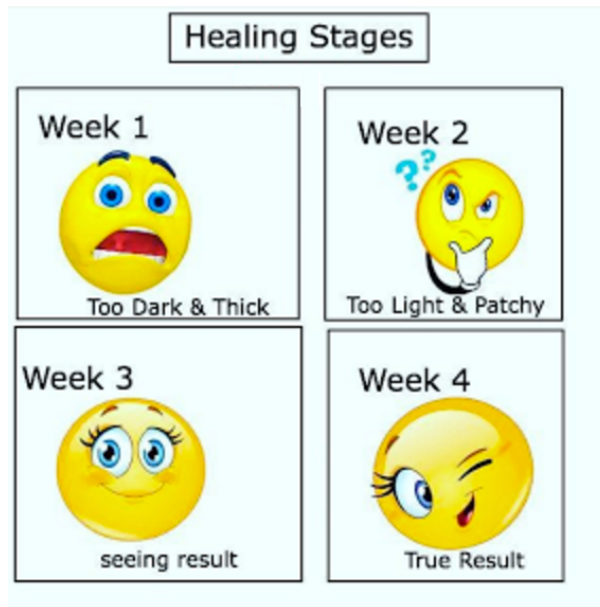

### Healing Stages:

The simple illustration below is a basic summary of the healing stages after permanent makeup and microblading procedures.



### Lips:

A long acting antibiotic has been applied to your lips. Do not clean the lip area for one day. If lips are still sore after arriving home, you may apply a cold compress. Don't apply any other ointment than the one given to you.

Some skin shedding and fading is normal. Apply lip balm as needed. A few people may get fever blisters. This is normal and should be no cause for alarm. Do not scratch or peel off the scab as it will fall off normally.

**Eyeliner:**

A long acting antibiotic has been applied to your eyes. Do not clean the eye area for one day. If eyes are still sore after arriving home, you may apply a cold compress. Don't apply any other ointment other than the one given to you. Don't sleep on your face as it may cause eyelid swelling. In some cases, upon arising the next morning, the eyelid may appear a little more swollen. This is normal and will subside throughout the day. Some itching, skin shedding and fading is also normal. Do not insert contacts right after the application of permanent make-up.

**Eyebrows:**

A long acting antibiotic has been applied to your eyebrows. Do not clean the eyebrow area for one day. If swelling persists you may apply a cold compress over the eyebrows. Don't apply any other ointment other than the one given to you. Skin will shed a little and will resemble fine dandruff. The color will fade. This is normal and there is no cause for alarm.

**General instructions for ALL permanent cosmetic make-up applications for 7 days following application of permanent cosmetics including after touch-ups:**

- Touch-up visits should be scheduled between 30-45 days post procedure. All Permanent Make-up procedures are a two-step process. Results are not determined until touch-up application is completed.
- Do not touch the healing pigmented area with your fingers, they may have bacteria on them and create an infection.
- The follow up is intended to fill in any discoloration caused by the healing and shedding process and must be done 30-45 days after the procedure. Follow up charge will apply.
- Apply your favorite antibiotic ointment or Vaseline 3-5 times daily until the procedure area has healed. Always use a clean cotton swab and not your fingertips. We suggest Vaseline, as it is non-reactive in most clients.
- No make-up, tinting or lashes or brows, sun, soap, sauna, Jacuzzi, swimming in chlorine pools or in any recreational bodies of water especially the ocean, contact with animals or gardening for 7-10 days until area is completely healed post procedure.
- Before bathing, gently apply a light coating of Vaseline on the procedure area using a clean cotton swab. Continue this regime until the procedure area has completely healed.
- Do not rub or traumatize the procedure area while it is healing (pigment may be removed along with crusting tissue).
- Use a "total sun block" after the procedure area has healed to prevent future fading of pigment color.
- Do not use products that contain AHA's on the procedure area. (Example: Glycolic, Lactic Acids. Always check your product labeling) They will fade your pigment color.
- Try to sleep on a satin pillowcase while the procedure area is healing.
- If you are a blood donor, you may not give blood for 1 year following your Permanent Make-up application (per Red Cross).
- If you have any questions or concerns please notify your technician immediately.
- If you experience any itching, swelling, blistering or any other complications post-procedure, stop using product and call your technician immediately. You may be allergic to the after-care product you are using!
- If you have excessive redness, swelling or tenderness or any red streaks going from the procedure site toward the heart, elevated temperature, or purulent drainage from the procedure site, contact your physician as the area may be infected and you may need to seek medical care.

## Beauty & Wellness Center

- Don't use shampoo or soap in the area treated including any type of cleansers or make-up removers for 3 days. Don't expose to the sun and don't apply make-up during the shedding of the skin. If possible, buy new cosmetics to prevent any chance of infection.
- Facials in the permanent makeup areas should always be avoided and not just for the first few days or weeks after permanent makeup sessions. The chemicals and scrubs typically used during facials can fade and even change the color of the permanent makeup ink.
- Reasons why the color might fade:
  - Aging process
  - Sun exposure, chemical peels, microdermabrasion, photo facials
  - Bleaching lotions, fading creams, Retin A
  - Dyed hair on the permanent make up area
- Use sunscreen every day to preserve the color for a longer time

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
